## 2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

- Some departments propagates the study of folkloristic through comparative and cross-cultural methodology with text and contextual understanding and consequently exploring the idea of unity in diversity in Indian situation as well as promoting deep understanding at global level.
- Some faculty members performing experiments on a new teaching methodology where a part of the subject is assigned to the students as project assignment after introductory knowledge imparted to them. Students prepared materials and Power Point presentation on the topic given to them then they present the same under his supervision as assignment which is evaluated as assignment. All study materials of some faculty members are kept in his website as open source as pdf or power point documents. Students can access these documents openly.
- Dr. Anirban Muhhopadhyay has developed websites for each of the courses he has taught and all the lecture notes and study materials are being uploaded in the course homepages so that the students can directly download those from the website.
- Mr. Malay Bhattacharyya is working on video courses to be streamed online for the benefit of the students. He has also introduced Massive Online Open Courses (MOOC) materials, available under open licensing, within the teaching aids in the Artificial Intelligence course (MCA-502) for the MCA final year batch. Self-assessment tests are also conducted for the improvement of the students. The wiki space platform has been introduced for open and interactive discussion throughout the course between the attendees.

## 2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching &amp; Learning processes:

Regarding the planning for the year collected 2014-15, all the reports from 2009-2010 to 2013-2014 year wise have been collected and a comprehensive report prepared. Applications received from faculty members for CAS are processed on regular basis. Sixty three applications have been processed by the 'CAS API Subcommittee' on the basis of quality benchmark/parameters, of which 27 applications are for Professor, 1 Deputy Librarian to Librarian (AGP 9000 to AGP 10000), 1 Assistant Professor AGP 8000 to Associate Professor AGP 9000, 8 Assistant Professor (AGP 7000 to AGP 8000) and 26 Assistant Professor (AGP 6000 to AGP 7000) are processed. Intercom connectivity is assigned to the IQAC (number 399) for direct access to the cell. The Annual Quality Assurance report has been prepared which is the result of the untiring activity of the cell which is published as a comprehensive outcome of the academics of the University for the session 2013-2014. Initiatives have been taken to restructure the IQAC section of the University web site. Student's feedbacks are collected from various departments and consolidated reports are prepared. Quality assessment of faculty members are done based on APR and CAS has been implemented. Various meetings with students, faculty members, heads, Officers and staffs were conducted to assist for enhancement of quality of education of the university.

- With the collaboration of West Bengal State AIDS Prevention & Control Society, from the year 2012-13, NSS K.U. has started Red Ribbon Club in order to spread awareness about AIDS – an uprising problem in India. Like previous year, this year also 30 colleges/units joined this club. With the help of Calcutta Medical College & University Health Centre, NSS, K.U. is also organising seminars and awareness programmes on AIDS since last 2 years. Apart from these colleges under Kalyani University which have NSS units, we are also organising awareness programmes using the Fund of West Bengal State AIDS Prevention & Control Society.
- On 11<sup>th</sup> April a programme was organised by NSS on ‘Swami Vivekananda o Adhunik Bharatbarsher Jubosomaj’. Srimat Swami Purnatmanandaji Maharaj was present there to rise up the spirit. A huge participation of students, research scholars, teacher etc. led this programme to a grand success.

Various trees were planted in front of Administrative Building beside the road of Arts & Commerce Faculty, in the backyard of Controllers Department and different hostels. various colleges under K.U. participated in these programmes. This year it was arranged on 16/08/2014.

- Students of our university were selected for state level trial of Pre-R.D camp 2013, held at 16/08/2013 at University of Kalyani campus. 6 of them got selected for participating state level camp. It was held at Vidyasagar University on 25/08/2013. Among them, Anupal Bhowmick has participated in East-Zone Pre-Republic day parade camp 2013 at Kolkata from 21<sup>st</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> October 2013. 8 participants were selected for the Republic day parade camp in New Delhi from all over west Bengal, one of them was from University of Kalyani. Moreover Total 13 Members of our University NSS Volunteers participated in the National Level Programmes.
- On behalf of NSS, University of Kalyani, 150 Dustbins were placed in the campus. Among them 50 Dustbins were outdoor type (Stand) and 100 were mobile/wheel Dustbin. This was a part of Campus Cleanliness and Beautification curriculum.
- Frame and Glass Boards, 8 Guide Maps, 1 Triangular Display Boards and 50 Sun Boards were also placed on behalf of NSS, University of Kalyani.
- In collaboration with the Ministry of Youth & Sports Affairs, Govt. of India NSS organised the nationwide lunch of “Rajiv Gandhi Khel Avijan” & “National Youth Policy-2014” on 21.02.2014.
- Over 100 volunteers of NSS from Kanchrapara College and Education Faculty of University of Kalyani guarded the Kalyani University Campus from trespassers on 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> March 2014. During the fair of ‘Sati Ma’ at Ghosh Para, numerous visitors use to trespass through the campus and cause a chaos in educational environment. This year the volunteers prevented them and helped to keep the campus intact. They also helped the visitors to enjoy the fair without any disturbance.
- Some cheaper medicines are served from the health centre as free of cost to the beneficiaries
- A 65mA X-ray Unit catered service to 74 patients with total 89 exposures @ ₹70/film.
- Pathological investigations are done approximately at ‘No Profit. No Loss’ basis. Reports are usually served on the same day.
- Complying with the Norms & Guidelines of ‘Bio-Medical Waste (Management & Handling) Rules 1998 and its Amendments, regular payment is made to Kalyani Municipality for autoclave service of Bio-Medical waste disposal, as generated on day to day practice.
- At arm’s Length, College of Medicine & Jawaharlal Nehru Memorial Hospital, a tertiary care teaching multi-disciplinary hospital is available within 2 Kilometre from Kalyani University with 24 hours emergency & domiciliary service. Another Super-Speciality Hospital namely Gandhi Memorial Hospital, catering especially heart related ailments is within 3 kilometre from the University campus. Arrangement of transport to the ailing, most of the time being provided by The University for carrying Non-ambulatory/Emergency patients for better management.

- Modifying the syllabi by introducing new course with interdisciplinary nature
- Existing curricular content is regularly monitored by the BoS in all PG Departments, in which external subjects experts actively participated in improving the content and revisions of curriculum. The curriculum is displayed on the website.
- Academic freedom is given to all departments under which curricular modification has been undertaken. Existing courses are redesigned after getting feedback from the different sections.

The University has constituted several committees to monitor the various academic programmes.

Semester system is running well; curricula review is carried out at regular intervals and efforts are made to introduce courses that are most urgently needed in the greater interest of the society. Special attention has been given by different departments in preparing the curriculum including Minor Elective papers of such papers offered under CBCS, keeping in view their interdisciplinary feature and the students who might offer choice for them. Regular updating of syllabus, Collaboration and help of external experts in BOS, Syllabus designing according to UGC/AICTE guidelines

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Preparing academic calendar well in advance.
- Using modern methods of teaching (lectures supported by teaching aids, computer projection, demonstration, live modelling, peer-tutoring, collaborative learning etc).
- Conducting unit tests, group discussions and home assignments etc.
- Conducting tutorial classes for better assistance in small groups and doubt clearing.
- Exposing students for outdoor learning through educational trips, excursions, camps, exhibitions etc.
- Motivating students for research activities.
- Teaching in the departments is mostly performed by regular faculties, inter-departmental faculty, visiting professors and invited speakers. Departments also take care of imparting improved qualitative and interactive knowledge to the students by arranging invited lectures by external experts in different fields, participatory workshops, seminars, and laboratory/ field based project works. Other than conventional methods (chalk board/white board) teaching is performed in many departments through adoption of e-content, digital method (ppt) or smart board. In some cases there is the practice of conducting socio-economic survey by students and group report writing which is assessed by teachers as a part of their examination. Students are also provided coaching for NET/SET examination and tutorial classes are arranged for slow learners. Interested students are also motivated to pursue a variety of co-curricular activities such as NSS, outdoor games, recitation/singing competition, drama etc. They are also exposed to a number of social benefit programmes by organising camps on blood donation, Health Awareness, Tree Plantation Programmes, Pulse Polio Immunization Awareness Programmes,

Anti-drug Rally, Cleanliness in campus etc. The programme 'Earn while you learn' has also attracted the students to contribute their labour during the period of their study.

- The University maintains the total number of teaching days as per UGC norms. Teachers are very particular and sincere in finishing their syllabus within the stipulated time period of each semester. All the teachers update their knowledge through participation in various state, national, international level seminars and conferences, workshops, training programmes etc. The INFLIBNET Centre helps the teachers, researchers and students in their advanced studies. LAN/WI-FI connectivity has been introduced in various administrative departments/sections of the University and fibre optic connectivity has been upgraded by 50 micron multimode.
- Students have been instrumental in giving their feedback on the status of teaching in different departments. The new recruitment of teachers has enhanced the faculty base in a number of departments and this has improved the teaching learning process.

### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

#### **EXAMINATIONS**

The examination notification is done in accordance with the academic calendar includes the following information.

Date of filling in examination forms, fees to be deposited, the documents to be produced during filling in examination forms, date of filling in examination forms with late fine.

Subsequent to the completion of form fill in programmes the schedules of examination are notified.

The examinations are conducted as per university norms and practices.

#### **EVALUATIONS**

To improve the quality of student's achievement, tests are conducted after the completion of a topic.

Extra classes are conducted by the faculties to complete the syllabus in the stipulated time. Practical classes are conducted with great care and sincerity for developing required skills within the students.

Evaluation of practical is usually completed before the commencement of theory examinations.

After the theory examination, answer scripts are coded and then assessed following strictly the rules and regulations laid down by the University and the result is declared in the stipulated time.

There is a three tier administrative system for smooth running and controlling the examination process. The controller's department bears this responsibility through three layers of administration headed in order by Controller, Deputy Controller and Assistant Controller. There is the provision of Under Graduate (UG) and Post Graduate (PG) board of studies in each department which are in direct touch with the controllers' department. The examination system in UG level is run in three parts. Before the start of the examination process the UG board of studies in a meeting sets the lists of question setters, moderators and examiners on the basis of their expertise and experience. It is an elaborate process as it involves the completion of examination of more than one lakh candidates and evaluation of their scripts. The question papers are reviewed and moderated by the subject examination committee to ensure that the guidelines are not transgressed and standard is maintained. In post-graduate examinations question papers are furnished by external examiners as well.

Spot assessment of answer scripts is followed in all the Final (Part-III) UG Examinations including Professional Courses. This enables quick publication of results [Final results are published within a month (approx.)]. As a result UG (Hons.) qualified candidates enjoy the advantage of exploring the admission possibilities in different universities without lapse of any year. Spot assessment system is also followed to review the answer scripts of all the UG Examinations for quick publication of results after reassessment of scripts. The entire UG

examination scripts evaluation process is conducted in a set up of head examiners for specific papers, who bear the responsibility of collecting the marks from examiners (under their supervision) in time and submit the collated the marks to the controller within the stipulated time. Some salient points are:

- i. Introduced objective type of questions in each paper along with subjective type of questions in UG examinations. The examination system is proved neutral by the involvement of external experts at the stages of question setting and moderation. At present however, only full internal checking of the scripts is in practice in order to facilitate speedy publication of results. This has been introduced for taking care of subsequent job pursuits /higher studies by the P.G students.
- ii. Internal Assessment is being followed in all Courses such as B.B.A., B.C.A., Bio-technology, M.B.A., M.C.A., M.C.T. etc., and also in the M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. Examinations (Semester System).
- iii. Submission and examination of Project work, Dissertation submission along with viva-voce test are conducted in U.G./P.G. courses.
- iv. Computerised Admit Cards are issued before the examinations and Computerised mark sheets in all the examinations are issued after publication of results.
- v. Provisional Certificates are issued after the publication of results.  
Original Computerised Diploma/Certificates affixing hologram and with University Confidential Securities are issued on the date of CONVOCATION of the University.  
To maintain confidentiality of the results of the examination the University has introduced the “Coding system” of the answer scripts of all courses in each semester examinations
- vi. In coherence with the right to information, the system of showing assessed answer scripts to the students of Post-graduate level has been introduced. The willing students may obtain the photocopy of assessed answer scripts on submission of requisite fees and on compliance of usual formalities.

The official staff of the controllers department extends heir supporting service in a very efficient manner which helps in better coordinating the examination and evaluation process.

- Some departments taken initiatives to publish Peer-reviewed research
- Improving library and laboratory facilities for facilitating research.
- Creating Laboratory infrastructure to extend the facility of research

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The University Central Library has a ‘Library Committee’ as a statutory body and act as an Advisory Committee.
- The Library Committee conducts their meetings at regular intervals to discuss on the needs of the users, present status of the library, takes decision to purchase and subscription of library resources discuss about the development improvement of the library system and services and assure involvement of appropriate authority for necessary measures.
- Some significant initiatives implemented on the advice of the library committee are:  
Extension of library building, improved library budget, Emphasis on subscription of e-resources, Opening of Open Access Stack Room for the users, Installation of facilities for

disable person, Extension of library service hours, Installation of bar-code system, Installation of seminar hall.

- Library automation programme was started in the year 1995 using CDS software package developed by UNESCO and since the year 2005 library automation software had been changed and started using SOUL software package developed by INFLIBNET centre. All the in-house technical work has been done through the present software.
- Total number of computers for general access – 20 desktop computers with internet connectivity
- Internet band width speed 10 mbps (INFLIBNET) and 1 GBPS from Printers
- Central Library has set up an archive for digital preservation of e-resources using D-Space software and plans to archive all the publication produced by the faculty members of the Kalyani University.

### **Central Library provides following services:**

The central library has a good books lending system for the students, faculties ,scholars, employees against valid library cards for a specified period. The central library provides reference service to the users with Reference sources, rare books and Theses.

Information Deployment and Notification-University notices, students related forth coming events or new arrivals or any other information related to students are normally displayed on notice boards and in the university website. Internet Access –Provides internet and email service to the users. Students can downloads the research papers and articles as and when required by them in the library. Leading journals of various subjects and e journals are available in the central library.

### **6.3.6 Human Resource Management**

- The University imparted short term training programmes as outreach activities through Adult and Continuing Educations Department. Different short term courses have been conducted to train the people of nearby villages to generate awareness including self employment. 11 such programmes were conducted by Department. 7 short term training programme were conducted by the Centre for Information Resource Management. Various departments are also conducting training courses for manpower developments.
- We were honoured to have Mrs. Neeta Chowdhuri (IAS), secretary, Ministry of Youth Affaires & Sports, Govt. Of India and Mr. P. K. Pattanayak, Youth Officer, NSS Regional Centre, Kolkata visit us on 5<sup>th</sup> February 2013. NSS volunteers performed in front of them and they showed their satisfaction regarding NSS activities.

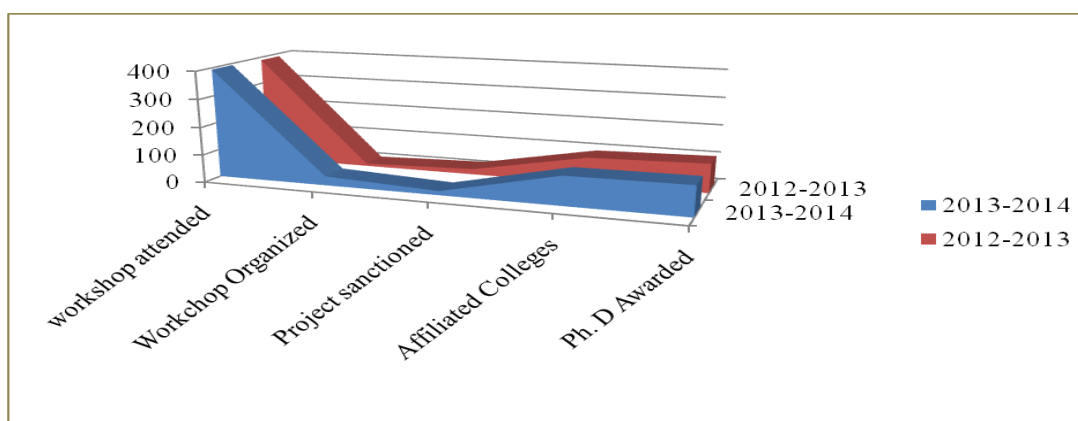

## **8. Plans of institution for next year**

- Department of Zoology is planning to renovate the existing laboratories with marble-top tables, tiled floors and hanging light facilities. The department has one class room with proper floor mats and Air-conditioner and sound system. Next year, department is going to develop a second class room with such facilities.
- Department of Microbiology is planning for up gradation of syllabus as per Course-Credit system and improvement of Laboratory infrastructure
- Department of Bengali has planned for a departmental journal (with ISSN) and Students skill development programme
- Department of Commerce has planned for Publication of Departmental Journal (Business Perspectives) and a two-days International Level Seminar
- The department of Computer Science & Engineering is planning to open a B.Tech. course in Computer Science and Engineering as decided in the Executive Council. In this regard we have already applied for permission from AICTE and the higher education department, Govt. of West Bengal. Introduction of this course will enrich the department and increase the total strength thus giving better opportunities for attracting IT companies for direct campus recruitments. New PCs and other laboratory equipments are to be purchased for giving better facilities to the students, scholars and the faculty members. The department will conduct a workshop for the non-teaching staffs of the university to teach them MS Office. The syllabus for the existing MCA and M. Tech. courses will be revised.
- The Department of Economics took the decision to bring out a journal (print version) – Kalyani University Journal of Economics (KUJE). The printing work is now complete. We have already obtained the ISSN for this journal, which is 919-2348-9219 and the first issue of the journal will be publish soon.
- The department of English intends to apply for the UGC SAP-DRS with a project entitled “English in Bengali Culture and Identity: 1817 to the Present”. Dr. Baisali Hui is entrusted with the responsibility of drawing up a proposal for setting up a Language Laboratory for the benefit of the departmental students. Prof. S. Chaudhury has applied for another Major Research Project to extend the purview of the work she has done as part of her first Major Research Project on Shakespeare Criticism in Bengal
- Choice based credit system for M.Sc courses are prepared and introduced by the Department of Environmental Science probably from the coming session
- The department of Folklore planned to introduce of M. Phil Course in Folklore, to make the departmental Folklore Museum well equipped with different articles and make it open for the viewers. The department has also plan to introduce the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in PG Level in the coming session.
- Department of History plans to develop its activities, to upgrade the syllabus, to offer more subject-options to the students in the future.
- Department of History plans to strengthen the IT facilities in the department for the advancement of the frontier research areas in LIS, to provide Xerox facilities to the students, to introduce integrated MLIS course from next academic session, design of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) curricula for integrated MLIS

- Department of Mathematics has plan to conduct successfully the UGC SAP DRS-I Programme, introduce modern teaching methods e.g., multimedia presentation etc., increase library space of the Department, diversify the research activities of the Department by collaborating with other Departments and Institutions.
- Department of Molecular Biology & Biotechnology is planning for introduction of full-fledged choice based credit system in the M. Sc. Courses, introduction of research works in the emerging field, up gradation of practical syllabi based on the newly introduced instruments, introduction of research facilities in the field of bio-processing and fermentation technology.
- Development of one play field in front of the Department is the plan of the department of Physical Education. Major plan of Department of Physics is to procure all the equipment awarded through the DST-FIST scheme as early as possible, development of a proper Laboratory space in the ground floor for hosting the major experimental set up, complete networking of the Department – classrooms, office and laboratories through Wi-Fi, development of smart class rooms and a second seminar room for holding small scale conferences that will typically be of a couple of days duration at the most, proposal for the establishment of a Centre for Theoretical Studies (CTS) in the spirit of the IIT, Kharagpur or IISc, Bangalore, and its feasibility are being considered.
- Department of Physiology is planning for the construction of 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of permanent building for the Department of Physiology, to upgrade and develop laboratories for Environmental Physiology and Electrophysiology, cell culture laboratory, Physiological Chemistry, Histology, Experimental Physiology, Ergonomics and Exercise Physiology, with adequate furniture and equipments for the purpose of PG courses and research, to upgrade the existing laboratories, to upgrade the existing class room into smart class rooms with audiovisual facilities
- Department of Political science is planning for a bi-annual journal titled “Journal of Political Studies”, organize an international seminar, changing the existing syllabus along with switching over to smarter and modern teaching methods, applying for SAP
- Department of Rural development is planning for Seminar and Workshop, lecture programme by distinguished academicians/practitioners in the field of rural development and management, Research and Consultancy, training (if sponsored by external agencies like SIPRD or NIRD), extension work to nearby villages, introduction of M Phil course in Rural Development & Management, Introduction of PG Diploma course in Panchayat Management.

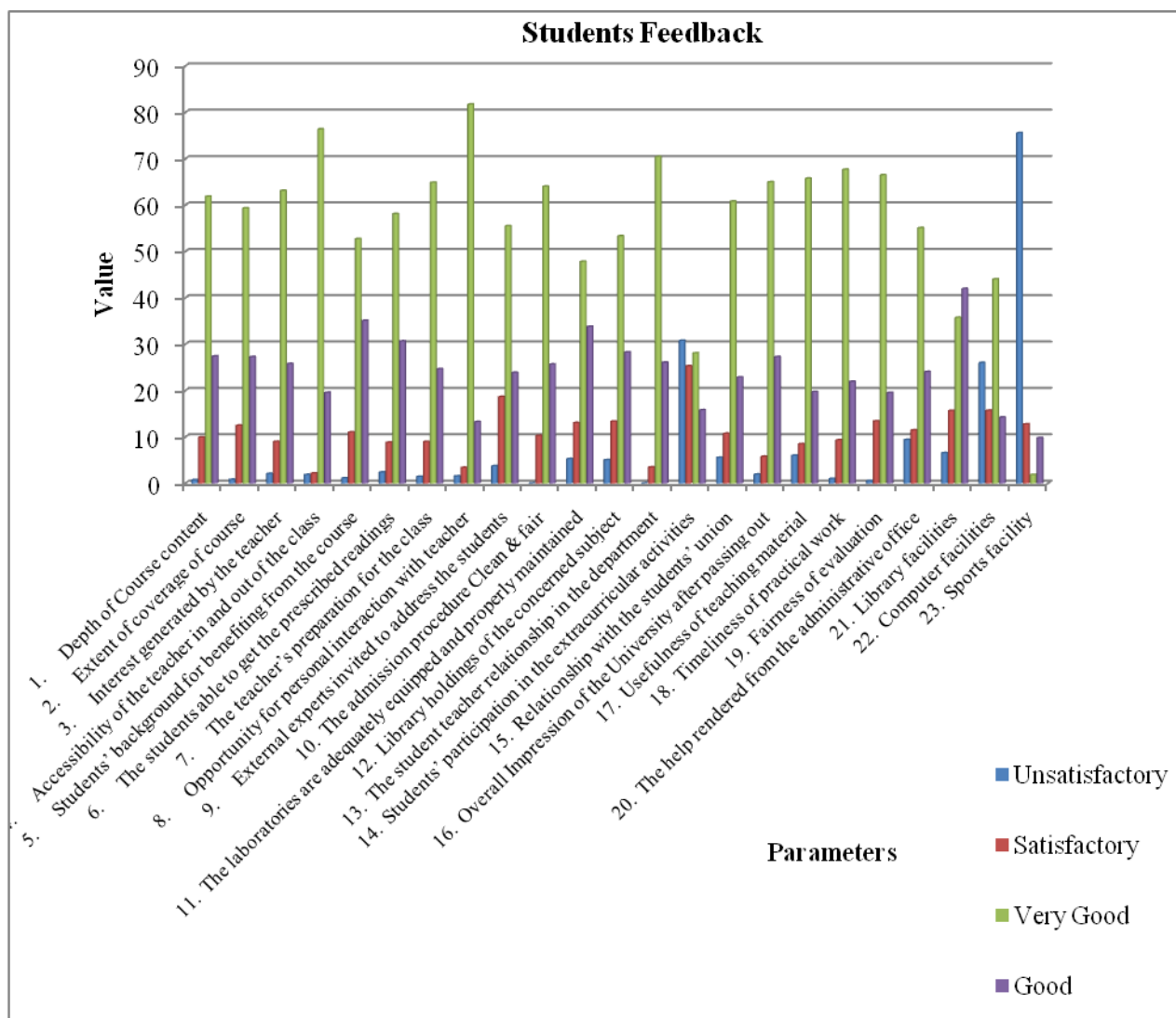
