Evaluation of practical is usually completed before the commencement of theory examinations. After the theory examination, answer scripts are coded and then assessed following strictly the rules and regulations laid down by the University and the result is declared in the stipulated time. Before publication of the result a prepublication scrutiny is made. Answer scripts are also made available to have a look on the same based on same criteria.

The University has a regular plan of action and we are going ahead with this. Let us retrospect some of the characteristics attributes are clearly seen from the following table. From the table it is clear that we are ahead in terms of attending conferences presenting papers organizing Seminars and Conferences, increasing the infrastructure in terms of integrating more undergraduate colleges, more Ph.D, new projects . The graphical representation clearly shows our achievements and concerned.

- The number of affiliated colleges has increased from 104 to 118.
- Number of application for admission to all PG courses increases marginally but number of admitted students decreases due to change of policies of admission.
- There is a decrease of number of awardees in all UG degree programmes by 2,571 compared to previous year. Also there is a marginal decrease of number of degree awarded to all PG programs.
- There is a depletion of admission in Distance mode of Education compared to previous year.
- From the report it is observed that admission to M.Phil has increased from 13 to 33 but admission to Ph.D. program decreased substantially.
- Number of students qualified more this year in National Level Tests (Net, GATE etc.)
- Some faculty members leave the institution but some also joined, as a result, teaching strength of the university remains almost same.
- There is a marginal depletion of nonteaching staff of the University.
- The attendance of the faculties into various workshops increased considerably. Also research publication of faculties is increased. More number of projects received by the faculties compared to previous year.

8. Plans of institution for next year

- The Department of Adult , Continuing Education and Extension is starting Master Degree Programme in Adult Education
- The Department of Bengali has planned for a departmental journal (with ISSN) and seminars & workshops. Student's skill development programme.
- The Department of Biochemistry and Biophysics made arrangement of Industrial and research Institutional visit for the students for their more exposure
- The Department of Computer Science & Engineering is planning to open a B.Tech. course in Computer Science and Engineering as decided in the Executive Council. In this regard we have already applied for permission from AICTE and the higher education department of West Bengal. Introduction of this course will enrich the department and increase the total strength thus giving better opportunities for attracting IT companies for direct campus recruitments.
- The department of Computer Science & Engineering is planning to apply for DST-FIST project grant.
- The Department of Commerce has planned for Publication of Departmental Journal (Business Perspectives), a two-days International Level Seminar and Publication of Edited Book.
- The Department of Physics planned to complete networking of the Department – classrooms, office and laboratories through wi-fi. They have also plan for development of smart class rooms and a second seminar room for holding small scale conferences that will typically be of a couple of days duration at the most. A proposal for the establishment of a Centre for Theoretical Studies (CTS) in the spirit of the IIT, Kharagpur or I I Sc, Bangalore, and its feasibility are being considered.
- The Department of Political Science has planned to organize an international seminar.
- The Department of Sociology has planned to open M.Phil. Course from the next academic session (i.e.2016-17). They have also planned to organize seminars and workshops, arrangement of invited lectures by distinguished scholars.
- The Department of Visual Arts has plans to invite eminent artists from different parts of India and abroad for interactive workshop and seminars.
- The department of Zoology have planned to renovate the Animal House.

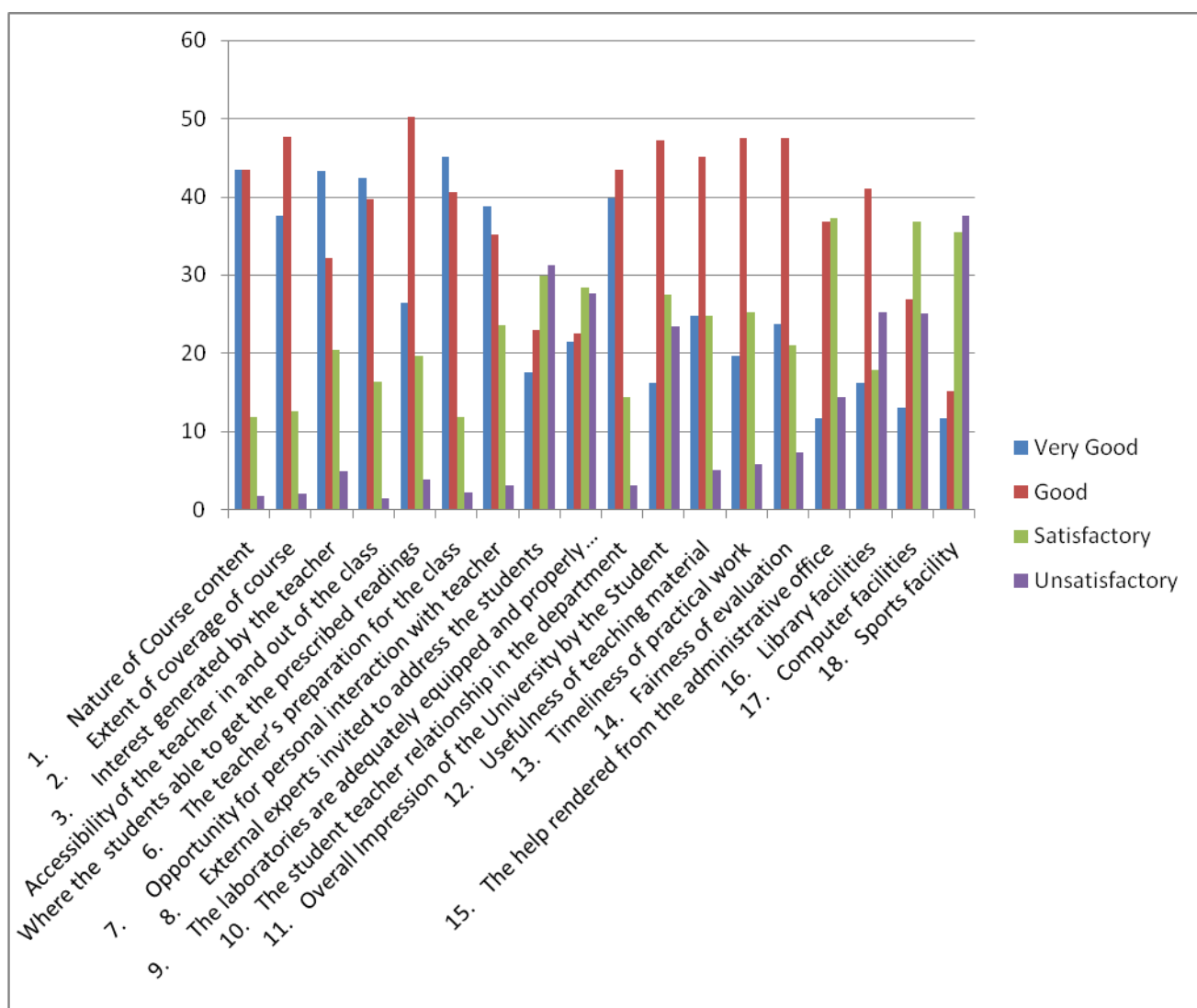
