5. Procedure for admission: 5.2. The University shall admit students who have qualified UGC-NET (including JRF)/UGC-CSIR-NET (including JRF)/SLET/SET/GATE/ have appointed in University Research Fellowship programme (URS)/have passed M.Phil. or Teachers fellowship holders as per stipulation of clause 5.1 of the Section 5 above. But, they shall be exempted from the Written test part of RET based on affirmative recommendation of DRAC and assent of hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. Admission of those students shall be governed strictly by the relevant regulations as stipulated under clauses 5.3, 5.4, 5.5, 5.6, 5.7 and 5.8 below.	5. Procedure for admission: 5.2. Students/ applicants who have qualified UGC-NET (including JRF)/ UGC-CSIR- NET (including JRF)/ SLET/ SET/ GATE/ have appointed in University Research Fellowship programme (URS)/ have passed M.Phil. or Teachers fellowship holders (regular whole-time teachers holding substantive posts) shall be exempted from the written part of RET based on affirmative recommendation of DRC and assent of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. Admission of those students shall be governed strictly by the relevant provisions of these regulations.
