

REGULATION RELATION TO EXAMINATION FOR THE DEGREE OF 5 YEAR INTEGRATED B. A. LL. B. (HONOURS) UNDER SEMESTERIZED CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) [AS AMENDED UPTO DATE]

Notwithstanding anything contained any where in the Regulations or Rules otherwise decided by the Executive Council, it is hereby provided that 5 Year (Ten Semester) integrated B. A. LL. B. (Honours) Course under Semesterized Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) will be held according to the following Regulations. These Regulations will come into effect from the Academic Year* 2018-2019. The University of Kalyani makes these Regulations in exercise of the power conferred upon it by Section 49 of the KALYANI UNIVERSITY ACT, 1981 (AMENDED UPTO 2012).

1. These Regulations shall be called the Regulations relating to the Five Year integrated B. A. LL. B. (Honours) Course under Semesterized Choice Based Credit System (CBCS).
2. There shall be a course of study leading to the degree of B. A. LL. B. (Honours). The duration of the Course shall be Five Years having Ten Semesters viz., Semesters I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX and X.
3. The Subjects and Papers for the Course shall be notified at the commencement of the Course in each Semester. The university shall have the discretion to amend and revise the Course Structure from time-to- time upon the recommendations of the Board of Studies in Law.
4. Duration of each Semester shall be ordinarily of six months; for I, III, V, VII and IX- July to December and for II, IV, VI, VIII and X- January to June of every year and at the end of each Semester there shall be an Examination. All answer scripts shall be written in English only.
5. A student is required to attend all classes. He/she shall be allowed to appear at the Semester-End-Examination if he/she has 75% or above attendance in Lectures/Tutorial classes held during the Semester. If the attendance falls below 75%, then he/she shall not be allowed to appear in the Semester-End-Examination. He/she have to take re-enrolment in the corresponding Semester.
6. candidate having the attendance below 75% except on justified medical ground but above 50% may be considered for appearing in the Semester-End-Examination subject to approval by the University Authority.

* Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters constitute one Academic Year.

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7. A candidate shall have to pass in each of these Examinations to qualify for the B. A. LL. B. (Honours) Degree.
8. A candidate who has prosecuted a regular course of study in Semester I shall be admitted to that Examination subject to submission of Examination Enrolment Form and other requirements in such form and within such time as may be notified by the University.
9. i) A candidate who has passed the Examination of Semester I/II/III/IV/V/VI/VII/VIII/IX/X and prosecuted a regular course of study in Semester II/III/IV/V/VI/VII/VIII/IX/X, as the case may be, shall be admitted to the respective Examination subject to submission of Examination Enrolment Form together with the other requirements in such Form and within such time as may be notified by the University.
ii) The list of qualified candidates who has passed the Semester II/III/IV/V/VI/VII/VIII/IX/X Examinations, as the case may be, shall be published by the University as soon as possible after the Examination.
10. i) If a candidate after attending a regular course of study in a Semester fails to enroll as a candidate for the respective Semester Examination or fails to present himself /herself at the Examination or appears but fails to sit for more than two papers on account of illness or fails in more than two papers or for any other reason as considered sufficient by the university, he/she shall be eligible to appear in all papers in immediately following two consecutive Examinations of the same Semester.
ii) In such event he/she shall not be required to attend the regular classes.
11. The evaluation scheme shall contain two parts:
 - i) Internal Written Assessment/Evaluation and
 - ii) Semester End ExaminationThe ratio of weightage between the Semester End Examination and Internal Assessment shall be 80:20. The College Authority shall formulate its own method of Internal Written Assessment/Evaluation. The interpretation of the written evaluation shall be as follows:
 - i) Project Work: 10 marks
 - ii) Project Presentation: 5 Marks
 - iii) Attendance and Class Performance: 5 Marks

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12. The Board of Studies in Law, duly constituted by the University, shall recommend a panel of names of Paper –Setters, Examiners, Scrutinizers, Reviewers and Moderators for Semester End Examination who will be appointed by the Controller of Examinations of the University.
13. The Paper –Setters, Examiners, Scrutinizers, Reviewers and Moderators for answer-scripts of all Semester End Examinations shall ordinarily be the Whole Time Teachers holding either substantive posts or contractual appointments drawing minimum basic pay of an Assistant Professor. The Paper –Setters, Examiners, Scrutinizers, Reviewers and Moderators of Social Science Papers shall be the Whole Time Teacher or Part Time Teacher as recommended by the Board of Studies in Law. The Examiner of a Paper shall not be the Reviewer of the same Paper. A teacher who is the Examiner of a paper shall not be the Scrutinizer of the same Paper.
14. i) In order to qualify in a Semester End Examination, a candidate must secure 40% marks in aggregate provided that the candidate secures at least 40% in each paper.
ii) Non-appearance in a paper will be counted as failure in that paper.

15. Supplementary Examination

- i) A Candidate who fails to qualify or fails to appear in not more than two paper (s) but secures 40% marks in each of the remaining papers in a Semester; he/she shall be treated as *Failed but Supplementary (FS)* and shall be allowed to pursue studies in the next Semester. He/She shall generally be allowed to appear in Supplementary Examination (s) for only those Papers in which he/she has failed in the immediately two consecutive examinations.
- ii) If a Candidate fails to qualify in more than two papers in a Semester, he/she shall be treated as *Failed and Repeat (FR)* and shall have to repeat the Semester as a whole in the next year. He/she shall not be allowed to join classes of the next Semester. If he/she fails to qualify in the abovementioned examinations, he/she will not be allowed to prosecute further studies in that Course.

Provided the candidate shall have to complete this entire course within seven years from the year of first enrolment in the said course.

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16. Retaining of In-Semester Assessment Marks

The In-Semester Assessment marks (that is internal assessment marks) of FS candidate(s) in the Course shall be retained and carried forward.

17. Re-Assessment of Answer Scripts

A student may apply for post-publication re-assessment of answer scripts in any Semester End Examination for not more than two theoretical papers on payment of prescribed fees *within seven days* from the publication of result of the concerned examination.

18. A Special Final Examination of all the back papers not exceeding two for each candidate of Semester IX/X shall be held for such candidates normally after six weeks of publication of the result of the examination of semester X.
19. A candidate securing at least 60% marks in aggregate in all ten semester examinations, taken together, shall be placed in the First Class and the candidates securing 40% and above but less than 60% in the aggregate shall be placed in the Second Class.
20. There shall be Seminar Law Course and Clinical Law Course as approved by Course Structure and each Paper falling within this category of Seminar Law Course and Clinical Law Course shall be of 100 marks. The performances of the students in each of those papers shall be assessed through Internal Assessment.

21. Grading and Division

Grade and Credit System, Semester End and Final Grade Sheet, Transcripts, Letter Grades, Grade Points, SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) shall have following scale (scores on 100%)

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Semester Grade Point Average SGPA (S_i) = $\sum(C_i \times G_i) / \sum C_i$

Where C_i is the number of credits of the course and G_i is the grade point scored by the students

Cumulative Grade point Average (CGPA) = $\sum C_i \times S_i / \sum C_i$

Where S_i is the SGPA and C_i is the total number of credits in that Semester.

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points.

To complete the 5 Year Integrated B. A. LL. B. (Honours) Course under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) satisfactorily and qualify for degree:

- i) A student must obtain the minimum CGPA of 5;
- ii) A minimum of 40% marks to be obtained in each paper;
- iii) A student obtaining Grade F shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear in that examination.

FULL MARKS AND MARKS OBTAINED WILL ALSO BE SHOWN IN THE MARKSHEETS.

22. Without any contravention of the existing Act/Statute/Ordinance of the University, the Vice-Chancellor of the University shall have the power to settle any issue which is not covered under this regulation including the issue of *awarding grace mark of maximum one mark* in the cases where a candidate has failed due to shortage of one mark and also failed to secure 60% due to shortage of one mark.

23. If any case is not covered under these Regulations, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University shall have the power to remove the difficulty by issuing directions not inconsistent with the Act/Statute/Ordinances.

24. These Regulations will come into effect from the Semester End Examination held in December 2018.
