Exploring the Theme

After the end of colonial rule of nearly two centuries India achieved freedom through its struggle for independence. At the same time it has encountered with the Western notion of modernity. It has even questioned the dichotomy of the rulers as the colonial rule did not follow the western philosophy of welfare state during its long rule in India.

The freedom movement tried to uphold the spirit of nation-building which can be considered as an essential factor to move towards modernity. The fellow-feeling was a part of this process of nation making. After independence, the nation-state started to introduce various schemes for the welfare of the people. Now it is the time to evaluate the endeavour of the state in a historical way.
